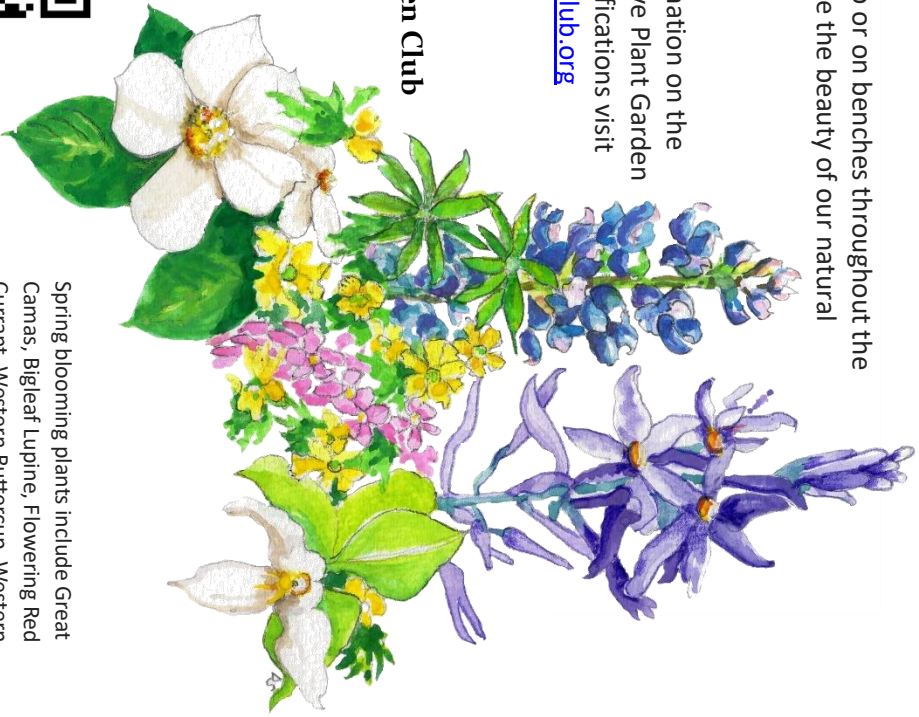

Spring blooming plants include Great Camas, Bigleaf Lupine, Flowering Red Currant, Western Buttercup, Western Trillium and Pacific Dogwood.



To reach the Northwest Native Plant Garden on the southern edge of Point Defiance Park: From the Point Defiance Park main entrance at the north end of N Pearl St, follow the signs for Zoo/Zoo parking. Follow the zoo parking access road to its end where it meets Five Mile Drive, NOT turning into the zoo parking lots. Turn left onto Five Mile Drive (it isn't signed) and proceed several hundred feet to the sign for the Northwest Native Plant Garden and its parking lot on your right. The garden is open from early morning until evening.
